

Christmas Honey, Wax and products of the hive competition

1. Two matching jars of light honey.
2. Two matching jars of soft set or naturally granulated honey
3. Two matching jars of honey displayed 'As for Sale'
4. Two matching beeswax candles, prepared by moulding or dipping.
5. One jar of honey to be judged on taste and aroma only.
6. 6 honey biscuits or 6 pieces of baking from a tray bake. The recipe must contain honey
To be displayed on a plate.
7. A display of 3 items, a selection of hive and honey products.

Notes

1. The honey jars, with the exception of class 2, will only have labels supplied at the time of staging the competition.
2. Honey to be judged “on taste only” should be free of wax, debris and scum. This class is often called the black jar or blacked out class as the jars are often covered so the judge only assesses the aroma and taste.
3. The jars “as for sale” should be labelled with the sellers / producers’s own label.
4. The items in class 6 can, for example, be honey, moulded wax or candle, honey soap, wax wrap, polish, lip balm, mead or other honey drink etc. etc. Literally any product that contains either honey, wax, or other hive product.
5. We will accept any shape or size of jar in all classes, preferably 227g or larger.
6. Honey for baking can be from any source and need not be your own honey.
